BACKGROUND: Presented for your review and comment is the annual police report. 2015 was my first full calendar year as your Police Chief and I believe our Police Department has stabilized from our restructuring that occurred in mid-2014; we all know our new normalcy. Our Officers have become efficient in their new roles and responsibilities and all have shown professional growth. I am proud of each of them. I believe our department is operating with efficiency and our Officers and staff all genuinely believe in our mission and carry like goals. We are all putting forth our best efforts to provide the services our community expects and deserves.

Reported crimes in our City increased by 37 incidents over our 2014 figures. Criminal traffic and drug related offenses made up the vast majority of our total increase in crime. I contribute the increase of those types of crimes to our Officers being much more proactive in self-initiated traffic contacts during in the past year. We conducted 3594 traffic stops in 2015 (54% of which resulted in warnings) in comparison to 1818 traffic stops in 2014. Generally speaking nearly all criminal traffic and the majority of drug offenses are discovered by Officers while on routine traffic stops. Additionally we absorbed a 629 incident increase in non-criminal matters in 2015 over 2014.

Jeffrey Long-McGie and Randall Campbell were new Officer additions in 2015. Both were initially hired as Officers working part-time hours. Officer Long-McGie was promoted to full-time status in September and Officer Campbell was approved to be promoted to full-time status beginning Jan. 1, 2016. Both Officers have done an excellent job for us and we are happy to have them.


