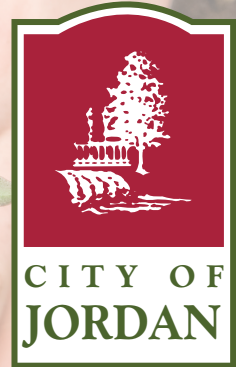


Live Green Organics Recycling



What Goes in Your Organic Container?

Refer to these lists to see what you can and cannot put in the organics bin. You might be surprised by what goes in it!

ACCEPTABLE

FOOD WASTE

Baked Goods (Pastas, Bread, Cereal), Nuts, Shells, Grounds, Filters, Tea Bags, Fruits, Vegetables, Peelings, Pits, Dairy Products (Yogurt, Cheese), Meats (Bones, Fish)

PAPER PRODUCTS

Shredded Paper, Paper Bags, Food, Soiled Products, Pizza Delivery Boxes, Egg Cartons, Flour, Sugar Bags, Napkins, Paper Towel, Parchment Wax

YARD WASTE

House Plant, Trimmings, Brush/Logs/Clippings, Leaves, Dirt/Sod, Plants, Flowers, Mulch, Trees

NOT ACCEPTABLE

Glass, Plastics, Rocks/Clay, Metals, Aluminum Cans, Treated Wood (Painted Wood Fences, etc.), Household Appliances/Furnaces, Paints/Oil/Chemicals, Paper Products without BPI - e.g. (Fast Food Wrappers, Paper Boats) Microwave Popcorn Bags, Cartons (Wax-Lined), Frozen Food Boxes, Take-Out Containers
