BACKGROUND: Presented for your review and comment is the 2022 annual police report. Total crimes (Part I and Part II combined) reported within our city decreased by 70 incidents overall in comparison to our 2021 statistics. Part I crime decreased by 31 incidents while Part II crimes decreased by 39 incidents year over year. Part I crime is deemed by the U.S. Department of Justice as “serious crime” which occurs with regularity in all areas of the country, and they are likely to be reported to police (Homicide, Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Larceny, Motor Vehicle Theft, Arson). Part II crimes are all other crimes not listed as and not considered as serious a Part I crimes (Simple Assaults, Forgery, Fraud, Embezzlement, Stolen Property, Vandalism, Minor Sex Offenses, Drug Crimes, etc.).

Overall calls for service (criminal and non-criminal combined) decreased by 835 incidents in 2022 when compared to 2021 totals; 8370 total calls for service in 2022 compared to 9205 in 2021.

Dear Mayor and City Council Members –

I present to you for your review the 2022 annual police report. Total crime (Part I and Part II combined) reported within our city decreased by 70 incidents overall in comparison to our 2021 statistics. Part I crime decreased by 31 incidents while Part II crimes decreased by 39 incidents year over year.

Part I crime is defined by the U.S. Department of Justice as “serious crime” which occurs with regularity in all areas of the country, and are likely to be reported to police (Homicide, Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Larceny, Motor Vehicle Theft, Arson). Part II crimes are considered all other crimes not listed as and not considered as serious as Part I crimes (Simple Assault, Forgery, Fraud, Embezzlement, Stolen Property, Vandalism, Minor Sex Offenses, Drug Crimes, etc.).

Overall calls for service (criminal and non-criminal combined) decreased by 835 incidents to a total of 8370 in 2022 in comparison to 9205 incidents total in 2021.

Yearly totals for calls for service at our 549 registered rental residential properties for 2022 ended at 629 with 52 crimes being committed. Yearly totals for calls for service at our 1735 non-rental residential properties in 2022 ended at 588 with 39 crimes being committed.

We were happy to partner once again in 2022 with the Jordan Public Schools on a cost sharing plan to re-implement a full-time School Resource Officer (SRO) into our school district. Trenton Silbernagel started his work within the Jordan Public Schools as the SRO in September at the beginning of the school year. As a result, an eleventh Officer position was authorized to backfill Officer Silbernagel’s previous Patrol Officer position. The job market for Police Officers is very challenging in the times we are living in currently and we ran short one Patrol Officer position through the end of 2022.

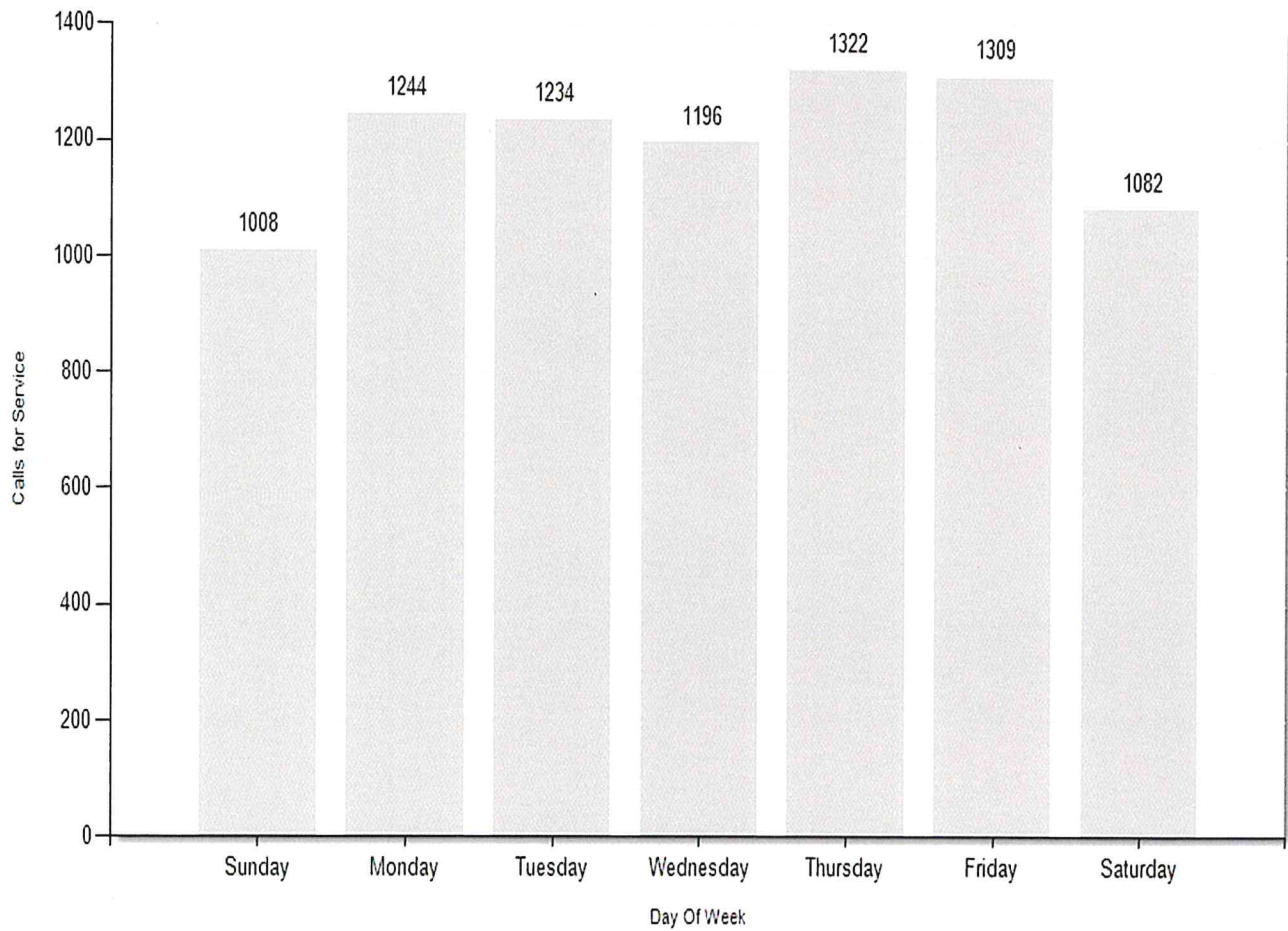


Calls for Service Day Of Week

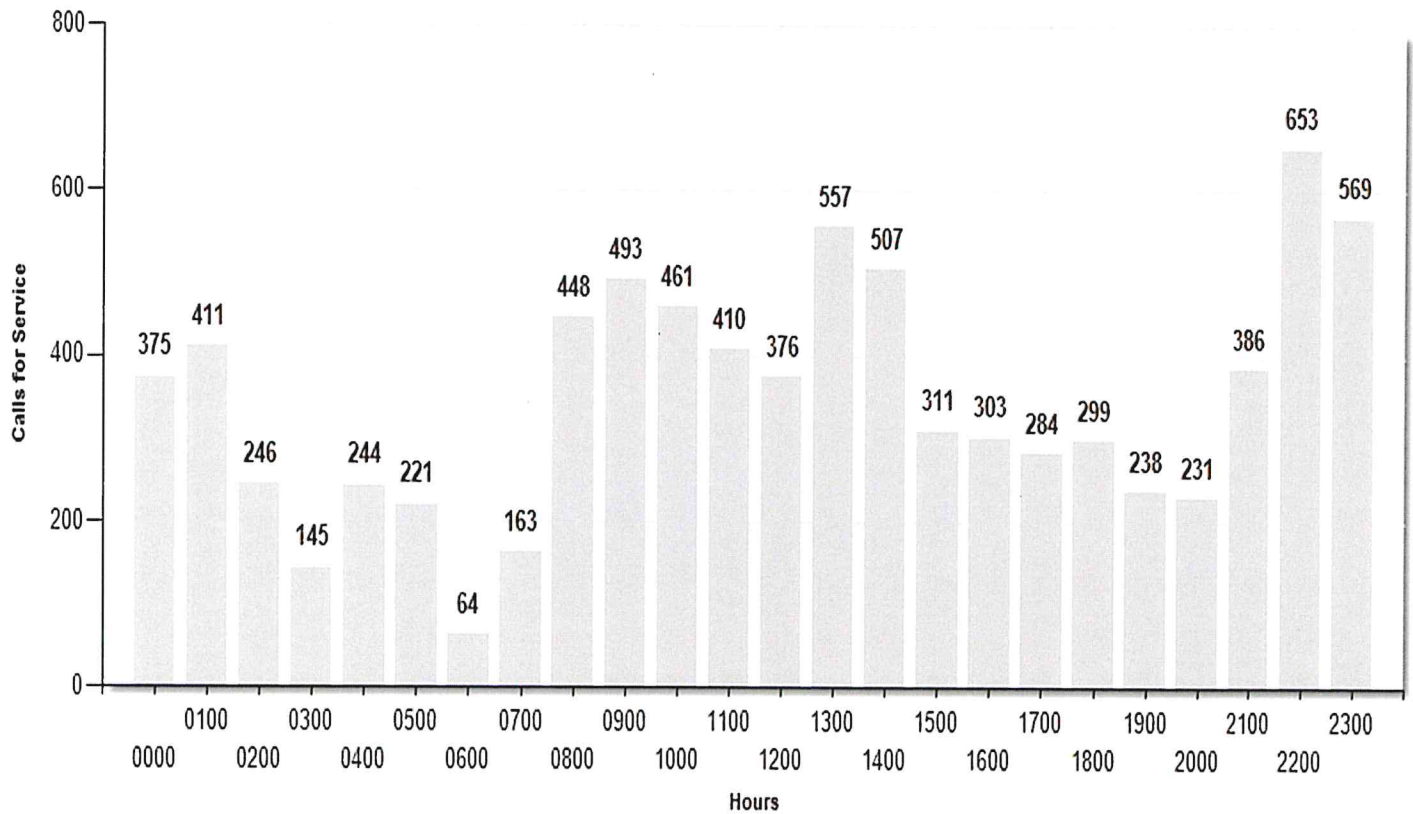




Calls for Service Hourly

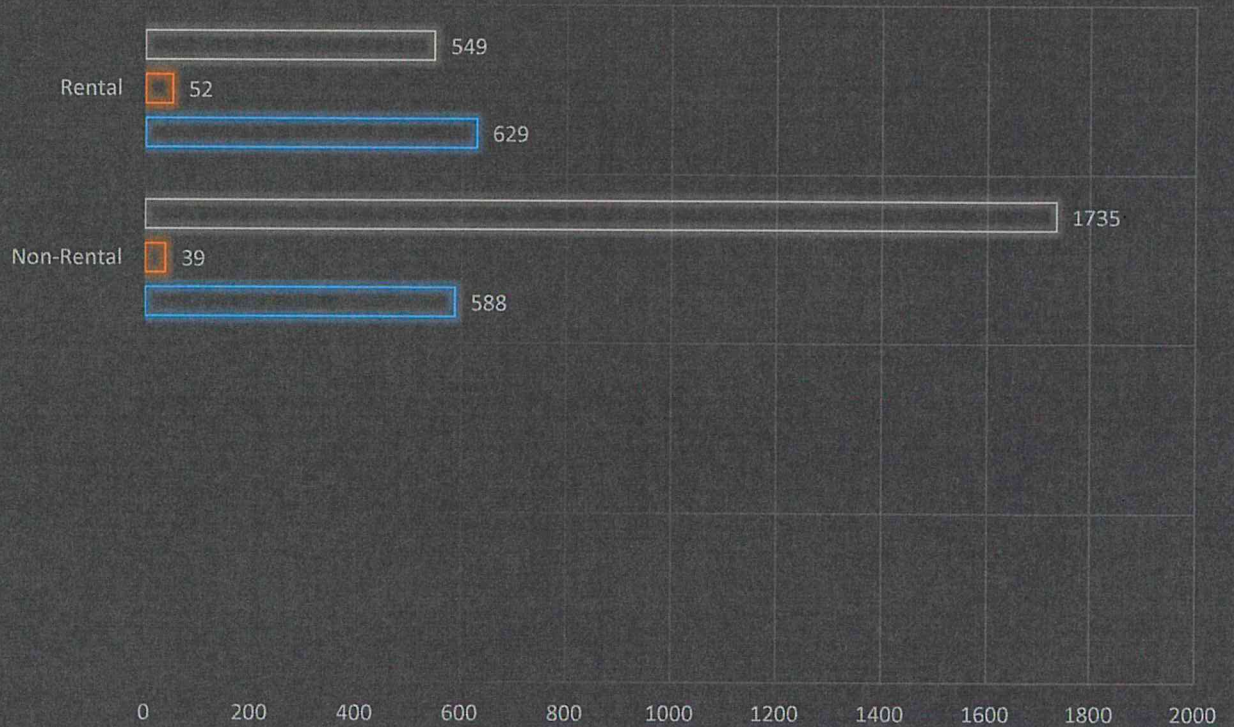

Residential Property Crimes 2022

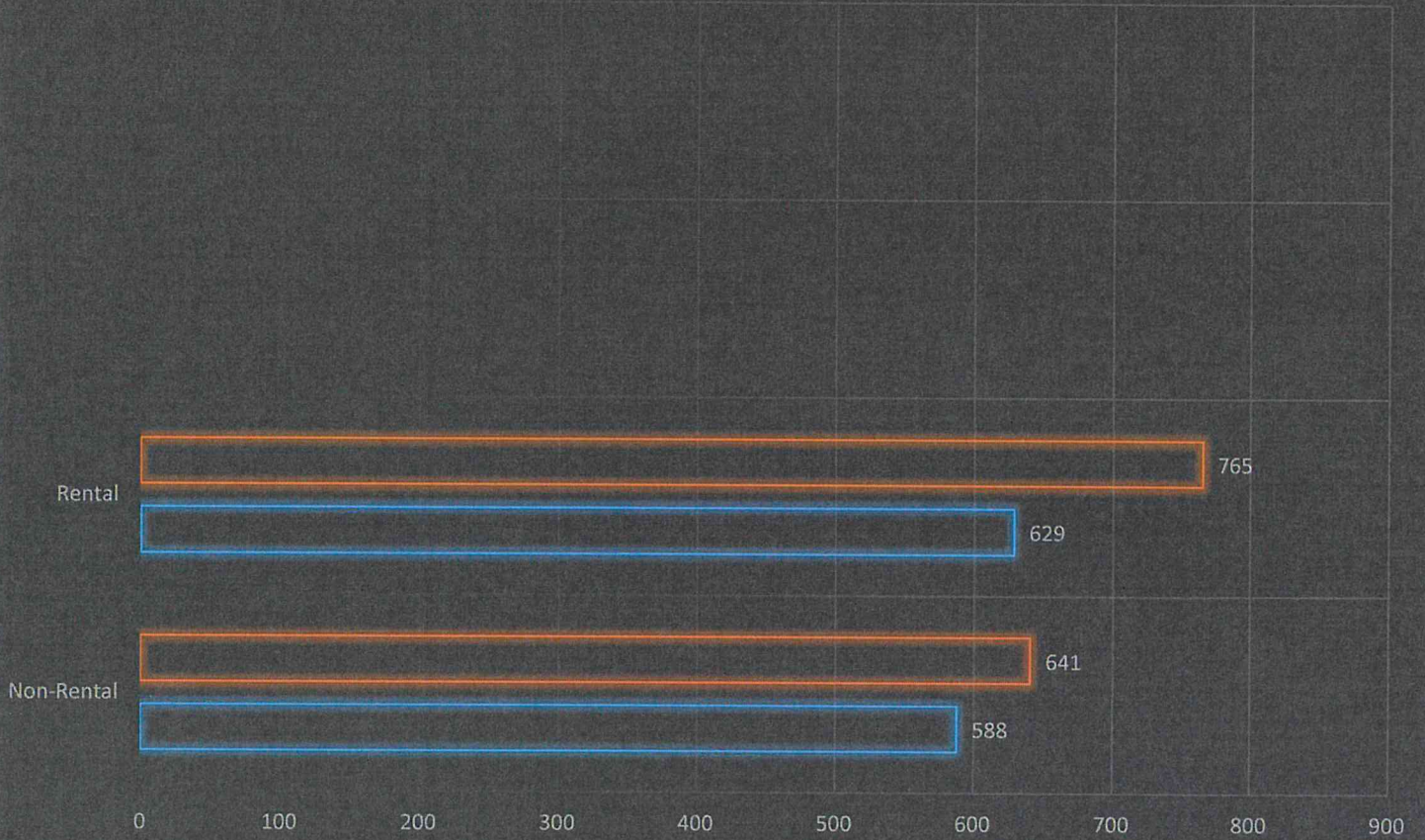
