Dear Mayor and City Council Members –

I present to you for your review the 2023 annual police report. Total crime (Part I and Part II combined) reported within our city decreased by 40 incidents overall in comparison to our 2022 statistics. Part I crime decreased by 8 incidents while Part II crimes decreased by 32 incidents year over year.

Part I crime is defined by the U.S. Department of Justice as “serious crime” which occurs with regularity in all areas of the country, and are likely to be reported to police (Homicide, Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Larceny, Motor Vehicle Theft, Arson). Part II crimes are considered all other crimes not listed as and not considered as serious as Part I crimes (Simple Assault, Forgery, Fraud, Embezzlement, Stolen Property, Vandalism, Minor Sex Offenses, Drug Crimes, etc.).

Overall calls for service (criminal and non-criminal combined) increased by 982 incidents to a total of 9352 in 2023 in comparison to 8370 incidents total in 2022.

Yearly totals for calls for service at our 694 registered rental residential properties for 2023 ended at 648 with 34 crimes being committed. Yearly totals for calls for service at our 1825 non-rental residential properties in 2023 ended at 658 with 36 crimes being committed.

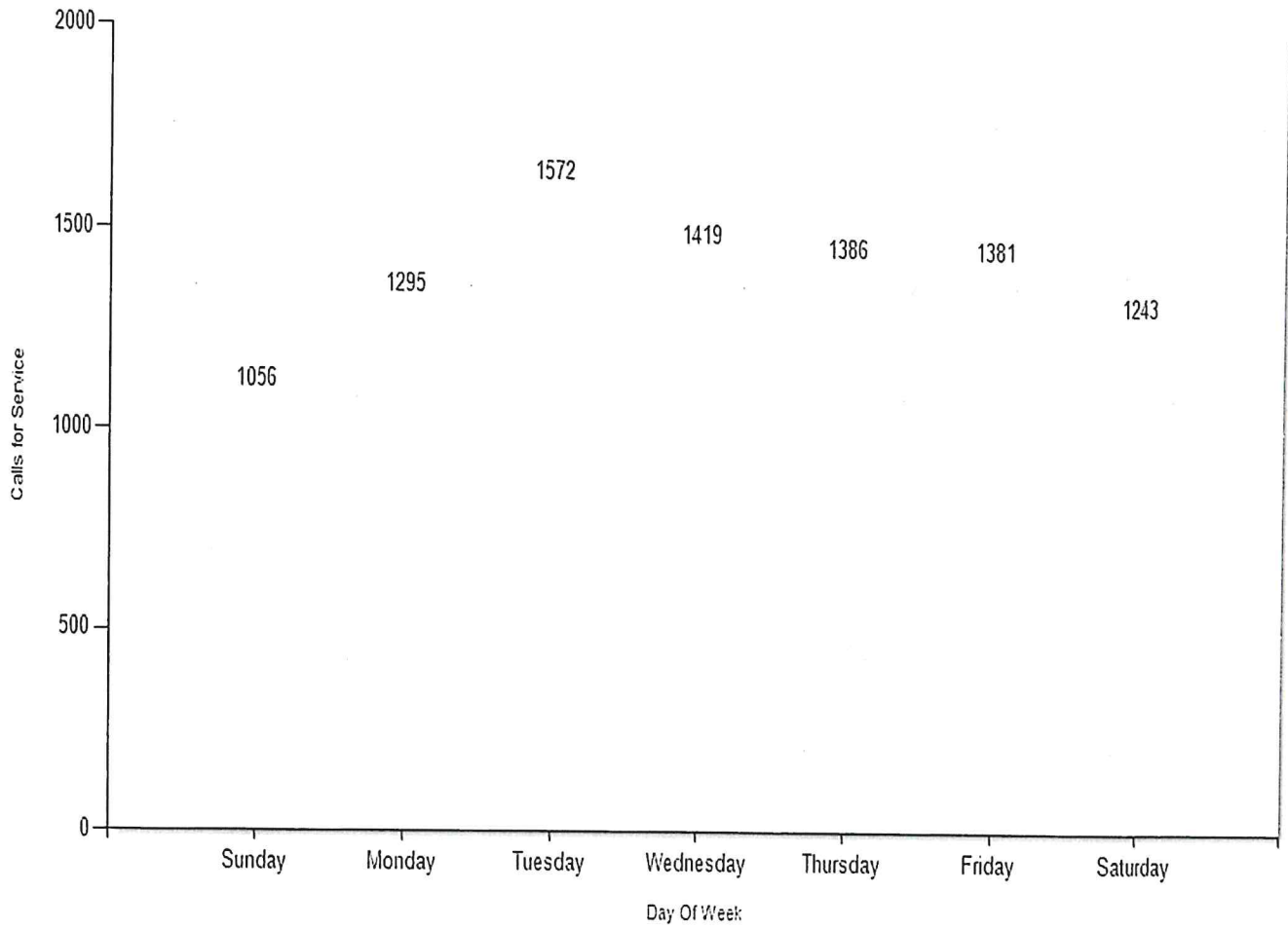

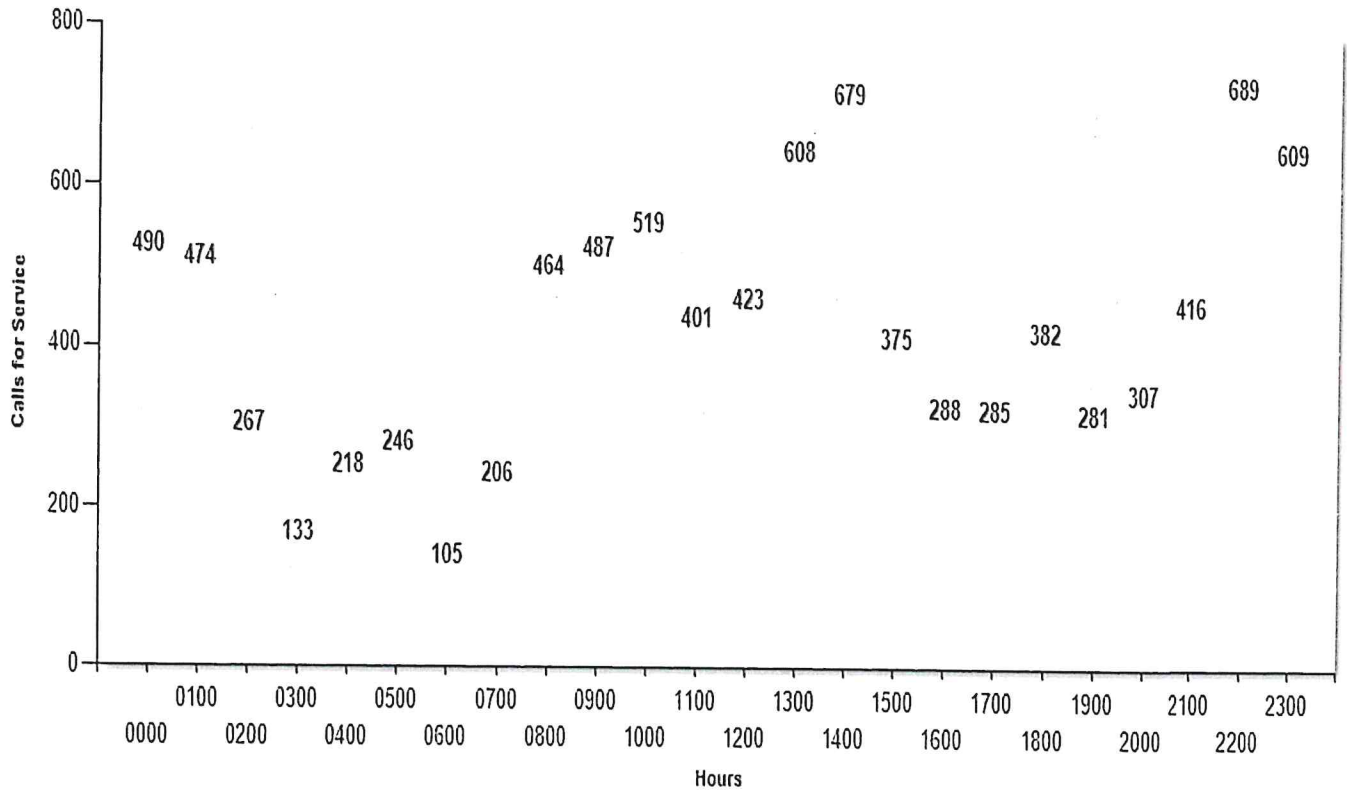

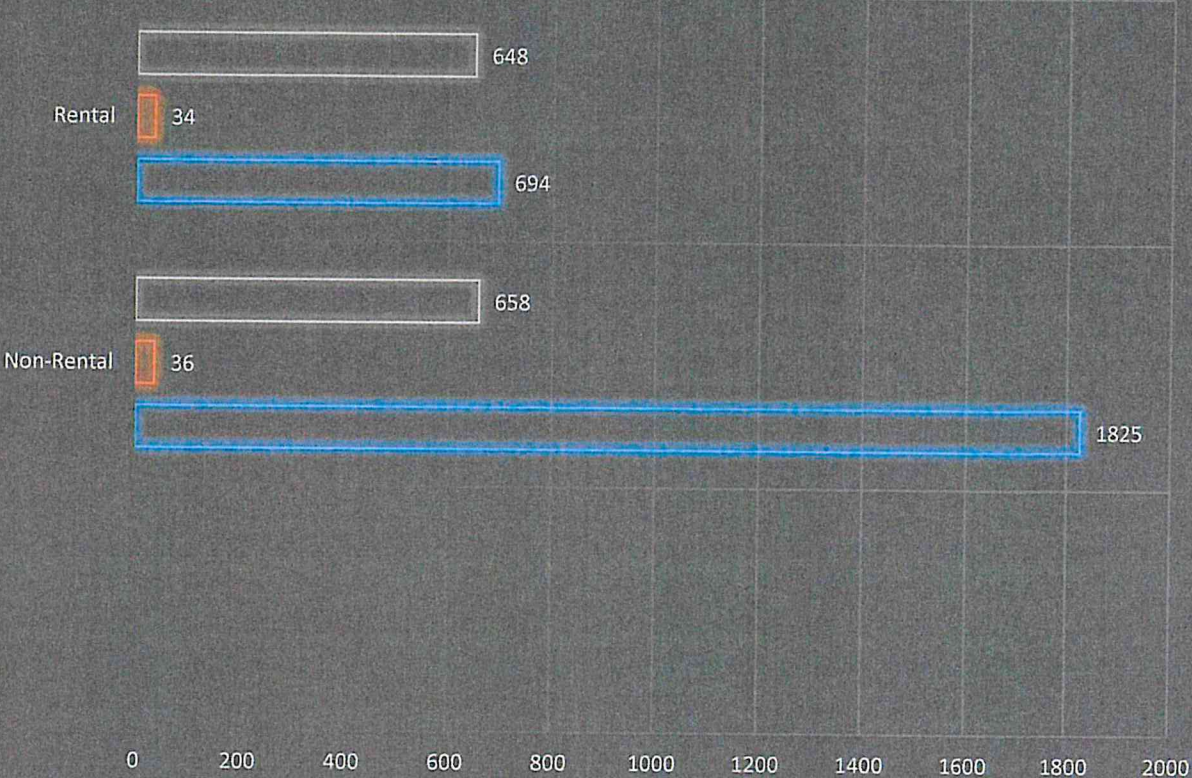

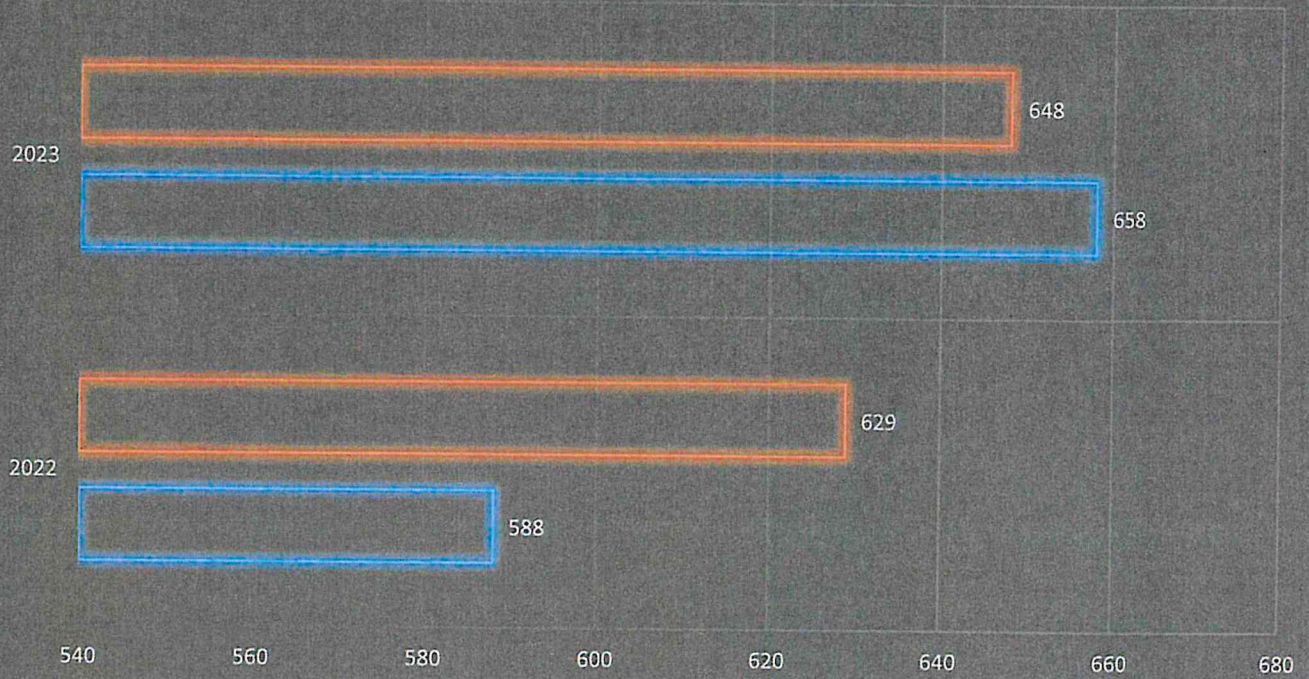
