HOME OWNERSHIP EDUCATION & WORKSHOPS

Are you considering purchasing your first home in 2024? Wherever you are on the path to homeownership, the Scott County Community Development Agency (CDA) can help. The CDA provides both one on one counseling and first-time homebuyer workshops that help prepare interested first-time homebuyers. Topics can include:

- Budgeting
- Credit score and how it impacts loans
- Mortgage loans and what to expect at closing
- Real estate overview and finding the right agent
- What to expect from a home inspection
- Home maintenance

In addition to one-on-one counseling, and in-person work-

It's Deck, Fence, and Shed Season! Summer is just around the corner and so is the building season! Many common improvements require a permit prior to beginning work. Permit applications are available at City Hall or online, under the "For Residents" tab under "Permits, Applications, and Forms." If you have any questions or require assistance in applying, please give us a call at 952-492-2535. Applications can be submitted via mail, email, or in-person at City Hall. Please allow ample time to get your permit issued by our City Building official.

Emerald Ash Borer Boulevard Tree Replacement Reimbursement policy

The city has determined that the health trees of the genus Fraxinus (commonly known as Ash) are threatened by fatal infections known as emerald ash borer. It has further determined that the loss of trees located on public boulevards (trees located within the City's right-of-way) would substantially depreciate the value of property and impair the safety, general welfare, and convenience of the public. It is declared to be the intention of the Council to control and prevent the spread of these infections and provide for the removal of dead, infected, or diseased trees on property that is a residential use.

The City offers up to 50% or \$500.00, whichever is less, of the cost of the removal and replacement of the tree. Proof of costs must be submitted to the City upon the completion of work must be detailed in such a way to identify costs for individual trees. If a property owner removes an infected tree themselves, proof of proper disposal that meets the requirements of the Minnesota Department of Agriculture must be submitted. The City has full discretion to accept or deny proof of costs.

Reimbursements will be prioritized for applicant's that have not received a reimbursement in the past, but otherwise are on a first come, first served basis and are limited to the annual amount the City Council sets aside for the program.

Reimbursement is limited to the ainthal amount the City Counter sets aske for the program.

Reimbursement is limited for a single property to two trees per year. When an applicant applies for the reimbursement for the first time, the total number of boulevard ash trees must be provided and the total number of infected trees. An applicant can reapply for further reimbursement in future years, until reimbursement has been made for all infected trees. Properties that have more than two trees that qualify for removal may remove all infected trees at one time and receive reimbursement for two trees per year up to the point that landowner has received reimbursement for the total number of qualifying removals and replacements. If funds remain in the annual amount after October 1st, previous applicants can reapply. The City will not automatically

process reimbursements and the applicant must reapply every year in order to receive the reimbursement.

In order to qualify for this reimbursement, the tree planted must be from the Approved Tree Species for Front Yard Trees list and must meet the standards of § 154.324 Landscape Requirements Residential. Additionally, proof of costs must be submitted to the City upon the completion of work for the reimbursement to be granted. City staff will confirm replacement trees have been planted before a reimbursement can be issued.




CONSTRUCTION TO BEGIN ON JORDAN'S PAULY PARK

Pauly Park:

Construction on the City of Jordan's Pauly Park will begin soon! A new park will be constructed this summer atop the bluffs between the Bluffs at Cedar Ridge and Heritage Hills developments. The park land is generally flat and surrounded by mature trees, making it an ideal location for a city park. The park was designed with an emphasis on ADA accessibility to meet the needs park users of all ages and abilities.
