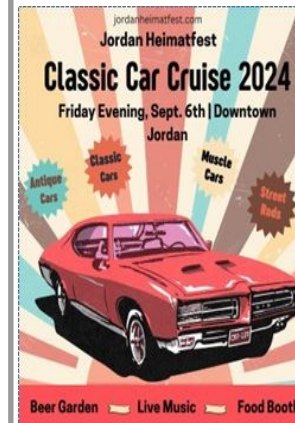

## Nicholas Stang– Boy Scout Troop 332 Completes Eagle Scout Project at Lagoon Park



Nicholas Stang contacted the City of Jordan with an idea for his Eagle Scout project. He set out to make Lagoon Park more accessible for all. He worked with Jordan’s Public Works Department with his vision. It was important to him that wheel-chairs and strollers had easy access and were close to the water, and that all beachgoers had a nice clean sandy beach to enjoy. Nicholas attended a Jordan City Council meeting to give a presentation and get approval from the council. Nicholas worked with Public Works and thought that a flower bed with large rocks on the south side of the beach, along with a staircase on the north side of the beach would help with erosion. Finally, a fresh layer of new sand was spread all over the beach. Nicholas met with the City of Jordan, Scott County, Commercial Club, Minnesota Valley Electric, Cemstone, Herman’s Landscaping, family, friends and fellow troop members, to apply for grants, received donations to fund this project. ## CITY INFORMATION /REMINDERS

### Watering Requirements

There are watering restrictions seven days a week, year round in Jordan. The restrictions include the odd/even system, plus time restrictions.  
-Customers whose home or business address ends with an odd number may sprinkle the lawn only on odd numbered days.  
-Customers whose home or business address ends with an even number may sprinkle the lawn only on even numbered days.  
-No sprinkling is permitted between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.  
A 30-day exception will be allowed for new seed or sod.

Remember most lawns need only 1” of water a week. The best time to water is between 3-9 a.m. when it is the coolest and the least amount of wind. If you notice someone watering illegally, please contact the Police Department.

### 5 STEPS FOR SAFE DIGGING

Working on an outdoor project? Always call 8-1-1 first, because you never know what’s below. Here are five easy steps for safe digging.

<b>1. NOTIFY</b> Call 8-1-1 or make a request online two to three days before you start.	<b>2. WAIT</b> Wait two to three days for a response to your request. Affected utilities will send a locator to mark any underground utility lines.	<b>3. CONFIRM</b> Confirm that all affected utilities have responded by comparing the markers to the list of utilities the 8-1-1 call center notified.	<b>4. RESPECT</b> Respect the markers provided by the affected utilities. They are your guide for the duration of your project.	<b>5. DIG CAREFULLY</b> If you can't avoid digging near the markers (within 18-24 inches on all sides, depending on state laws), consider moving your project.

The “Take It To The Box” containers located at the Jordan police Department at 705 Syndicate Street. Please drop off your unused prescription and over the counter medication there.

### DIRECTIONS:

- Leave medication in the original container.
- Remove your name and personal information.
- Keep the name of the medication on the original container.
- Place liquids in a padded envelope (provided near drop box).
- Drop medication into the disposal box.

### Fire Tips: Address Safety

Firefighters can't help if they can't find you. Your safety in an emergency depends on responders' ability to find you quickly.

- House numbers should be visible from the street.
- If your house is set back, affix numbers to a mailbox or post that can be seen from the public road.
- Trim any greenery and remove decorations that may block clear view of your address.
- If possible, post your address near a porch light, or use reflective numbers.
- House numbers should be at least 4 inches tall.
