All compost picked up (grass clippings, leaves, etc.) will need to be bagged in brown paper compostable bags.

 Any twigs, branches, brush that needs to be collected can be either bagged in brown paper compostable bags or bundled with twine. Bundles must not exceed four feet in length and the diameter of any branches must not be any larger than 3". No logs, stumps or branches that are larger than the parameters listed above. • No personal compost containers (55 gallon trash containers) as our drivers will not be able to utilize the tipping functions on our trucks to dump those containers

Code Red Notification System / Winter Parking and Snow Removal Ordinance



The call before the storm.

City of Jordan Code Chapter 73 governing winter parking and snow removal during snowfall events states as follows:

Section 73.08 - Parking Hours: Between November 1 and March 31 on First Street and Water Street only, from Mill Street to Varner Street, between the hours of 2 a.m. and 6 a.m., parking shall only be allowed on an odd/even basis; on even-numbered days vehicles may park on the even-numbered side of the street and on odd-numbered days vehicles may park on the odd-numbered side of the street.

Section 73.09 - Snow Removal: It is unlawful for any person to park any vehicle on any street after a continuous or intermittent snowfall during which there has been an accumulation of 1 inch or more of snow, or a Snow Emergency is declared, until all snow, ice and similar debris has been plowed or removed from the paved portion of the street. For purposes of this section the definition of street includes the city owned parking lots. An exception is that on First Street and Water Street only, from Mill Street to Varner Street, and in the Jordan City Hall parking lot and the City owned parking lot behind the Pickled Pig, parking shall be allowed on an odd/even basis; on even-numbered days vehicles may park on the even-numbered side of the street and on odd-numbered days vehicles may park on the odd-numbered side of the street.

Snow Emergencies will be declared by the City solely by text message and email through the Code Red Notification System provided by Scott County. City of Jordan residents can register free of charge for the Code Red Notifications System to receive alerts for various notification types including Emergencies, General, and Severe Weather. The geographical alert area is based on the home address you provide, thus you will only receive alerts that may directly affect you.

To receive snow emergency declarations from the City of Jordan, it is very important to register for the Code Red Notification System by visiting https://public.coderedweb.com/CNE/EA5343CC0ED6 or by visiting Scott County's main website and selecting the CODE RED icon. Please be sure to check GENERAL NOTIFICATIONS in the alert types section to ensure you receive snow emergency alerts from our City.

TREE TRIMMING

The City of Jordan Public Works Department will be pruning boulevard and right-of-way trees this fall. All limbs overhanging the sidewalk and roads will be trimmed back to the trunk of the tree. This will allow for better sight lines and clearance for vehicles.





STREET SWEEPING

Street sweeping is occurring this fall! Please keep your curb clear and don't rake your leaves into the streets. Please watch for our public works team out and about.

GARBAGE BINS

Reminder that your garbage bin should be placed behind the curb, not on the street.
