LANDSCAPING FOR RESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION

- □ An As-Built survey reflecting conformance with the approved grading plan is required.
- Yards must be final graded and sodded or seeded completely. The turf must have taken root over the entire yard and boulevard area.
- Curbstop must be to be set to proper height and checked by city staff after turf is in.
- One (1) tree must be planted within the front yard setback area- outside of drainage and utility easements. The tree must be of a disease-free species approved by the City (see opposite page for a list of species). A deciduous tree must measure at least 2" in diameter, as measured 6" off the ground.
- Parking within the front yard shall be on an improved surface consisting of concrete, brick pavers or asphalt-bituminous pavement. The Driveway Access Width of the driveway measured at the <u>Front Property Lot Line</u> through the boulevard to the Public Street cannot exceed 22' (16' is preferred).
- Should you consider constructing a retaining wall taller than 4' please check with the City to determine whether a permit will be required.



 Trees, plants, shrubs and retaining walls are prohibited in the public right-of way and drainage and utility easements.

LANDSCAPING MUST BE COMPLETED WITHIN 90 DAYS OF RECEIVING A CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY (C.O), UNLESS THE C.O IS ISSUED BETWEEN NOVEMBER 1 AND APRIL 15, IN WHICH CASE LANDSCAPING MUST BE COMPLETED WITHIN 90 DAYS OF APRIL 15. Once all landscaping requirements have been satisfied, please call City Hall at (952) 492-2535 to schedule a landscape inspection. Landscape escrow funds will be released contingent upon a passing inspection.

Please provide the name and address of the person/firm who should receive the landscape escrow refund. In the event that the recipient should change, it is your responsibility to notify the City.
