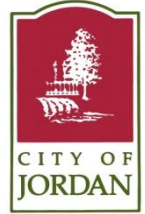

AGENDA ITEM: 11 (A) Annual Police Report - 2017

ACTION REQUESTED: Informational Only; Review and Comment

BACKGROUND: Presented for your review and comment is the 2017 annual police report. Total crimes reported within our City decreased by 8 incidents overall in comparison to our 2016 statistics. We saw increases in many of the crime reporting categories across the board, however I consider those increases for the most part to be insignificant, and we did also see narcotics crimes decrease by 81 incidents.

Overall calls for service (criminal and non-criminal totaled) increased to 8018 in 2017 over our 2016 total of 6774. Of those calls for service, 314 were medicals.

Thoughts from Chief Empey



Dear Mayor and City Council Members – As you all know we moved into our newly finished 6240 square foot police facility located at 705 Syndicate Street in the end of April 2017. It has been fabulous to work from such a professional building that offers exceptional space for us to better serve our citizens’ public safety needs. I can’t tell you how much I, our Officers, and our records staff appreciate this new building with the interview rooms, training room, workout room, locker rooms, office spaces, and other amenities! This building will serve our needs for years to come and let’s not forget the construction was accomplished without bonding and with no tax increases to our citizens or businesses.

October of 2017 marked the 1 year anniversary of our full-time School Resource Officer (SRO) Program within our public school district. The program has received high marks from our school district’s administrators across the board for providing excellent services and security to our schools students and staff. We also successfully negotiated a mutually agreeable contract with the Southwest Metro Special Education Cooperative (SWMEC), an intermediate school district consisting of 11 member independent school districts, to provide a full-time dedicated SRO to the River Valley Educational Center (RVEC) located on Hope Avenue in our City beginning in early 2018. The RVEC is located approximately 1 block from the Jordan High School. This will allow for two (2) full-time dedicated SROs to be within our school’s campus setting each and every day throughout the school year to provide services to students and staff, and to be able to respond immediately to any crisis situation that may occur elevating our overall school safety to an even higher level than is present currently.

Total crimes reported within our City decreased by 8 incidents overall in comparison to our 2016 statistics. Narcotics crimes decrease by 81 incidents; a rather significant drop.

Overall calls for service (criminal and non-criminal totaled) increased to 8018 in 2017 over our 2016 total of 6774. Of those calls for service, 314 were medicals.

I’d like to thank our City Council and the citizens of the City of Jordan for being so very supportive of our Police Department. Your support leads to our success.

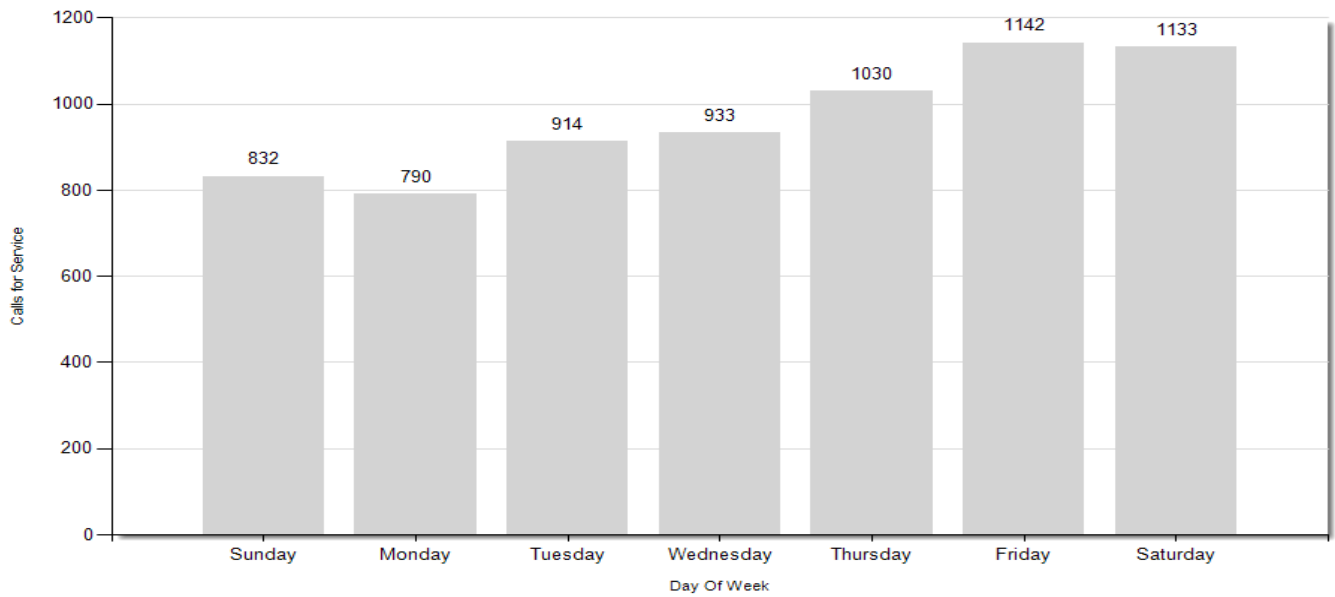

Calls for Service Day Of Week

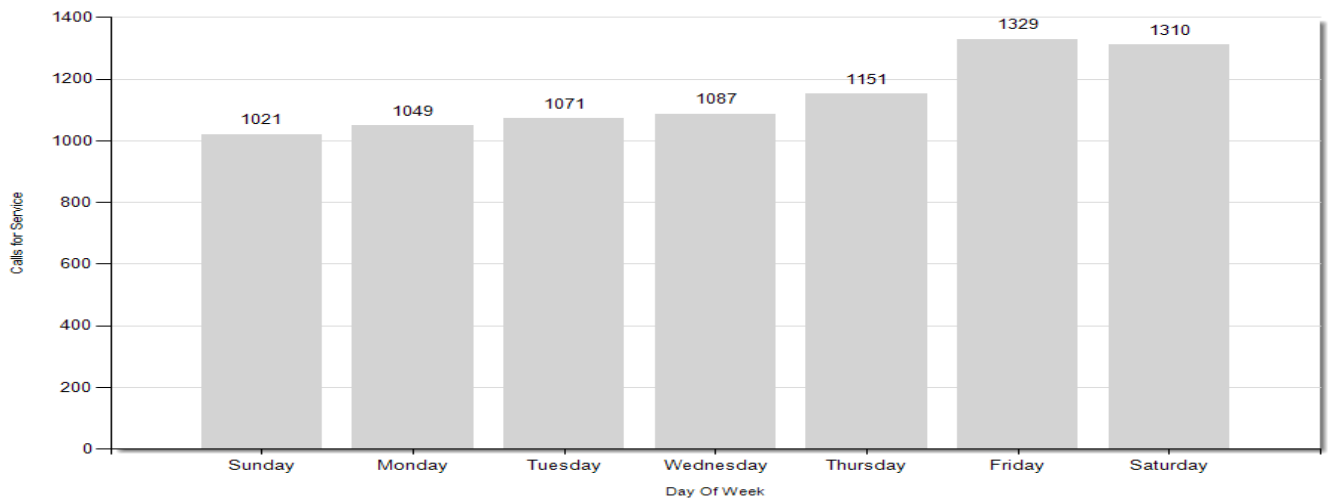

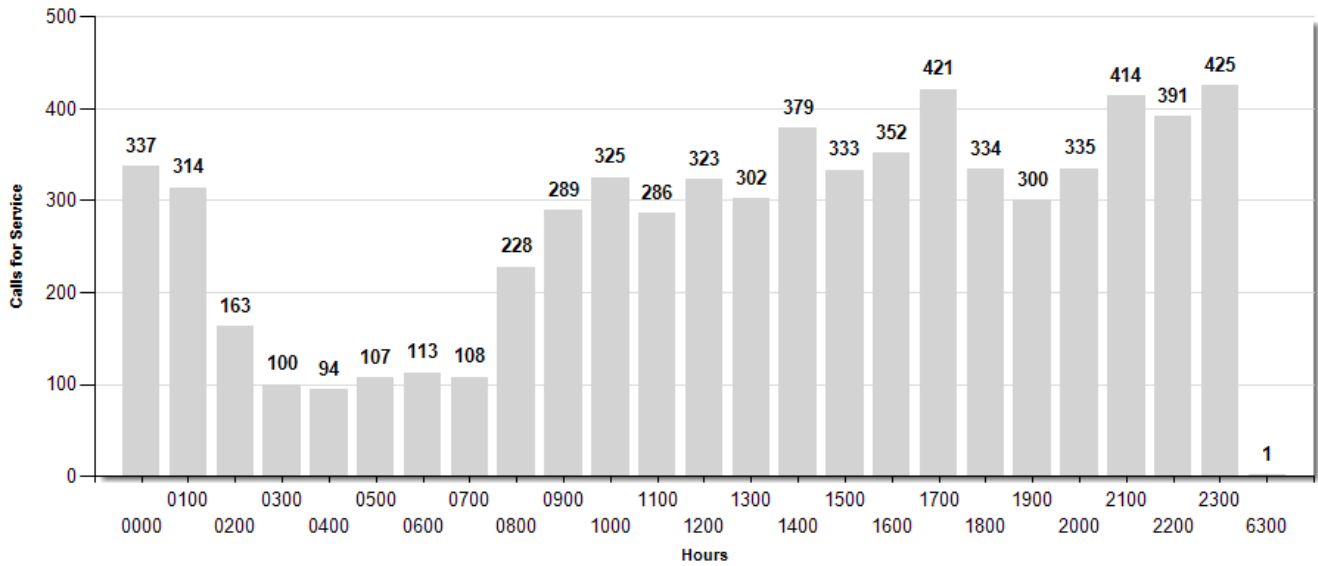

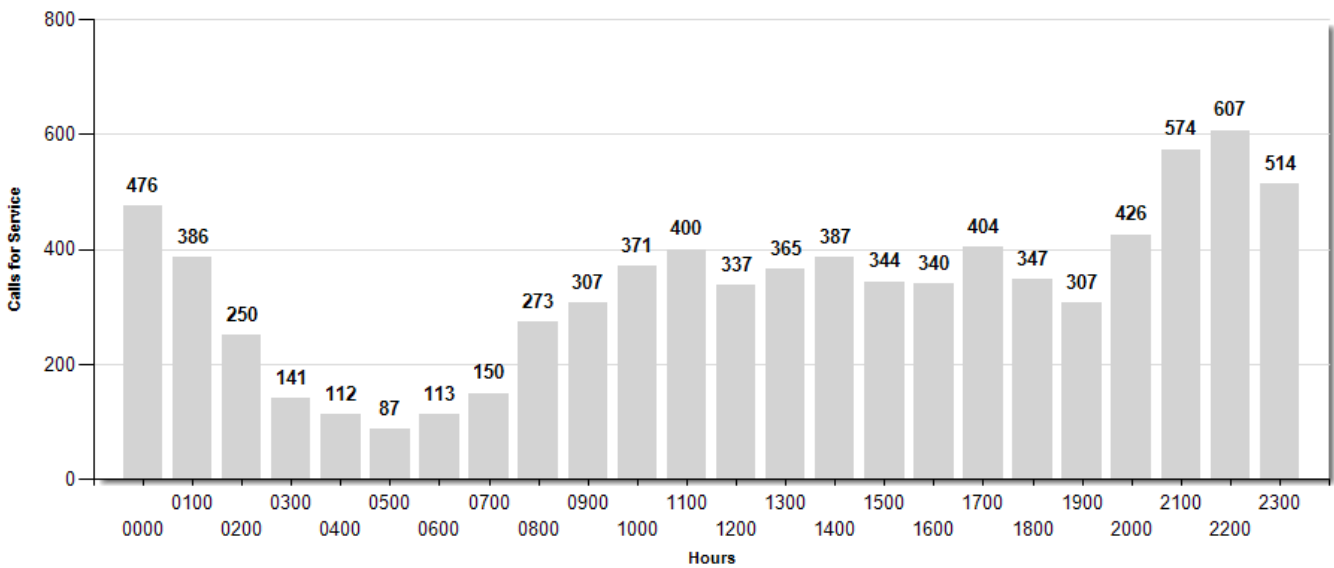


Calls for Service Hourly
