AGENDA ITEM: 13 (E) Annual Police Report - 2019

ACTION REQUESTED: Informational Only

BACKGROUND: Presented for your review and comment is the 2019 annual police report.

Overall calls for service (criminal and non-criminal totaled) increased by over 2000 incidents in 2019 over 2018. This due to the fact that we have started documenting directed patrols of our neighborhood and business districts (extra patrol) during 2019 to better show our preventative patrol activities. We also saw a reduction in overall crimes committed by just over 200 incidents; the majority of those (159) in fewer narcotics and DUI arrests.

Yearly totals for calls for service at our 549 registered rental residential properties for 2019 ended at 794 and crimes committed at 59. Yearly totals for calls for service at our 1735 non-rental residential properties in 2019 ended at 619 and crimes at 51.

Dear Mayor and City Council Members –

A short statistical summary of 2019 - crimes reported within our City decreased by 209 incidents overall, 156 of those the result of less narcotics and DUI arrests, most all other crime categories saw small percentage decreases also.

Yearly calls for service at our 549 registered rental residential properties for 2019 ended at 794 and crimes committed ended at 59. Yearly calls for service at our 1735 non-rental residential properties in 2019 ended at 619 and crimes committed ended at 51. In comparison, totals in this category in 2018 for residential rental properties ended at 931 total calls for service with 55 crimes committed; and for non-rental residential properties 683 total calls for service with 64 crimes committed.

Overall calls for service (criminal and non-criminal totaled) increased in 2019 over 2018 by 2148 incidents. This was nearly entirely related to a new practice of documenting better showing our directed preventative patrols (extra patrol) to our residential neighborhoods, park, and business areas within our City (2863 such extra patrols). Medical calls totaled 299.










Calls for Service Hourly
