



Household Organics & Yard Waste Site

Sign-Up

To participate, fill out the Household Organics & Yard Waste Sign Up form online or at City Hall. You will be given a key fob to access the Household Organics & Yard Waste Site. By making at least two drop-offs of household organics per month, you will be given free access to the yard waste collection. Residents that sign up to use the yard waste site only must pay the \$5 monthly fee. Residents who use only the household organics site will not be charged. Household organics collection is also open to St. Lawrence Township and Sand Creek Township residents. Restaurants in Jordan can also sign up to use the organics site.

Start Collecting

Use any container to collect organics at your house. You can reuse a coffee canister, ice cream bucket, or yogurt tub or you can buy a kitchen compost bucket online or in stores. Use a BPI certified compostable bag or a paper bag. Minimize odors by freezing your household organics until you can drop them off, or make regular trips to the Household Organics & Yard Waste site.

Drop Off

Use your key fob to access the site at 705 Syndicate St, Jordan, MN 55352. Place your household organics in the dumpster or yard waste behind the gate. Then, continue collecting! Pick up more BPI-certified compostable bags at City Hall or the store.

Yard Waste

Acceptable items include grass and leaves only. Branches are not allowed. Plastic bags may be used for transport to the Household Organics and Yard Waste site, however the yard waste must be debagged. Only BPI-certified compostable bags or paper bags will be allowed.

Why Compost?

Up to 30% of what you place in the trash bin is organic waste and it is illegal in Minnesota to dispose of yard waste in the landfill. By composting your household organics and yard waste, you are keeping it out of the landfill and creating a valuable soil additive used in landscaping and gardening.
