

BACKGROUND: Presented for your review and comment is the 2021 annual police report. Total crimes (Part I and Part II combined) reported within our City decreased by 12 incidents overall in comparison to our 2020 statistics. Part I crime increased by 6 incidents while Part II crimes decreased by 18 incidents year over year. Part I crime is deemed by the U.S. Department of Justice as "serious crime" which occurs with regularity in all areas of the country, and are likely to be reported to police. Part II crimes are all other crimes not listed as and not considered as serious a Part I crime.

Overall calls for service (criminal and non-criminal combined) dropped by 783 incidents in 2021 when compared to 2020 totals; 9205 total calls for service in 2021 compared to 9988 in 2020.

Dear Mayor and City Council Members -

I present to you for your review and comment the 2021 annual police report. Total crime (Part I and Part II combined) reported within our City decreased by 12 incidents overall in comparison to our 2020 statistics, however Uniform Crime Report defined Part I crimes did increase by 6 incidents year over year.

Part I crime is defined by the U.S. Department of Justice as "serious crime" which occurs with regularity in all areas of the country, and are likely to be reported to police. Uniform Crime Report defined Part II crimes are considered "less serious" offenses and those types of crimes decreased by 18 incidents in 2021 in comparison to 2020.

Overall calls for service (criminal and non-criminal combined) decreased by 783 incidents to a total of 9205 in 2021 in comparison to a 2020 ending total of 9988 incidents.

Yearly totals for calls for service at our 549 registered rental residential properties for 2021 ended at 765 with 60 crimes being committed. Yearly totals for calls for service at our 1735 non-rental residential properties in 2021 ended at 641 with 46 crimes being committed.

Our department went through rather significant personnel changes and challenges in 2021 as three (3) veteran Officers or 30% of our licensed staff left employment for various reasons. Those Officer positions were replaced throughout the year with newly hired Officers Holasek, Demko, and Ross. Our department was left short staffed for the majority of the year while we conducted hiring processes and trained in the new Officers.











