Code Red & Winter Parking

Snow emergencies will be declared by the City solely through text message and email from the Code Red Notification System provided by Scott County. Sign up to receive alerts relevant to your address about emergencies, severe weather and more. Register at https:// public.coderedweb.com/CNE/en-US/EA5343CC0ED6 or by clicking the renew yours today! link on Jordan's website. Please select "General Notifications" in the alert types section to ensure you receive snow emergency alerts from the City.

A reminder, it is unlawful for any person to park a car on any street after continuous/intermittent snowfall with 1 or more inches of snowfall accumulation, or when a Snow Emergency has been declared until the snow has been plowed from that street. Except for First St. and Water St., from Mill St. to Varner St., parking is allowed on the even-numbered side on even-numbered days and vice versa for the odd-numbered days (City Code 73.09).

If you reside within Odd/Even Parking areas, please park on the side of the street that corresponds to the date after midnight, as Public Works typically begins snow removal around 4am- 6am. For example, if it is 6pm on December 1st, please park your car on the even side as at midnight the date will change to December 2nd.

Annual Jordan Curbside Yard Waste Pickup Day-October 26th and October 27th

Fall is Here and the Leaves will be dropping! With Fall being here, compost is going to go on the rise! Buckingham will be hosting a free fall compost pick up service day on your service day on Wednesday, October 26, 2022 and Thursday October 27, 2022. Please call Buckingham to schedule a pick up at 952-226-6441.

All compost picked up (grass clippings, leaves, etc.) will need to be bagged in brown paper compostable bags. • Any twigs, branches, brush that needs to be collected can be either bagged in brown paper compostable bags or bundled with twine. Bundles must not exceed four feet in length and the diameter of any branches must not be any larger than 3".

No logs, stumps or branches that are larger than the parameters listed above. • No personal compost containers (55 gallon trash containers) as our drivers will not be able to utilize the tipping functions on our trucks to dump those containers.



Public Works Will Be Trimming Boulevard Trees

As part of Fall maintenance, employees from Jordan's Public Works department, will be trimming boulevard trees that are overhanging streets and sidewalks.

ICE AND SNOW ON PUBLIC SIDEWALKS

- (A) *Ice and snow a nuisance.* All snow and ice remaining upon public sidewalks is hereby declared to constitute a public nuisance and shall be abated by the owner or tenant of the abutting private property within 12 hours after the snow or ice has ceased to be deposited thereon in commercial areas and 24 hours after its deposit thereon in residential areas.
- (B) City to remove snow and ice. The city may cause to be removed from all commercial public sidewalks, beginning 24 hours after snow or ice has ceased to fall, and beginning 48 hours in residential areas, all snow or ice which may be discovered thereon, and it shall keep a record of the cost of the removal and the private property adjacent to which such accumulations were found and removed.
- (C) Cost of removal to be assessed. The City Administrator shall, upon direction of the Council, and on receipt of the information provided for in the preceding subdivision, extend the cost of the removal of snow or ice as a special assessment against the lots or parcel of ground abutting on walks which were cleared, and such special assessments shall at the time of certifying taxes to the County Auditor be certified for collection as other special assessments are certified and collected. (City Code 96.01)

Engineering Updates

Upcoming Summer 2023 TH 21 / CR 66 / Sawmill Rd Roundabout Project:

MnDOT is currently in the process of completing final design on a new roundabout at the intersection of TH 21, CR66, and Sawmill Road. This project is being led by MnDOT in coordination with both Scott County and the City of Jordan. Construction of the roundabout is planned for the spring/summer of 2023. The project scope includes:

Construction of a single lane roundabout similar in size to the TH 282/Creek Ln roundabout

New trail along the north side of CR 66, from TH 21 to Hillside Ave. To create space for this trail, the wide CR 66 shoulder is to be reduced in width.

New trail along the east side of TH 21 and north side of Sawmill Road, connecting the Sawmill Road sidewalk to the TH 21 bridge and trail.

Storm water improvement include a stormwater pond in the SW corner of the roundabout on property currently owned by the City.

An Informational Open House for the public to learn about the project is scheduled for Wednesday, November 2nd from 4 pm – 6pm at the City of Jordan's City Council Chambers located at 116 1st Street East. Residents are encouraged to attend anytime during the above-mentioned timeframe to speak with the project team and learn about the upcoming improvements. The intersection will need to be closed during construction, with detours established to direct both local and regional motorists around the area. Information on these detours will be provided at the informational meeting.
